



Radioiodine Referral Guidelines and Checklist

Thank you for choosing Southern California Veterinary Imaging. We are excited to provide you and your clients with an exceptional radioiodine referral experience. At SCVI, each patient is thoroughly evaluated and screened prior to treatment. In order to perform this evaluation we will need some information from you. Please review the following guidelines and complete the checklist when referring cats for radioiodine therapy.

Tapazole Trial: At SCVI, we recommend a Tapazole trial prior to treatment. The Tapazole trial is helpful to evaluate the renal function in your patient. In short, hyperthyroidism may mask renal disease and we are attempting to determine if renal disease will be present after radioiodine therapy.

After diagnosing your patient with hyperthyroidism, please start your patient on Tapazole. Your patient must be kept on Tapazole until thyroid levels have reached a therapeutic level which usually occurs in about one month (unless an adverse reaction occurs). After 1 month, please re-check your patients lab work (Chemistry/CBC/T4/UA) to evaluate your patient's renal function and thyroid status. After the Tapazole trial, your patient can either remain on Tapazole until their treatment date.

Once the Tapazole trial is complete and you have collected all the required information, please send the following items to us prior to the treatment date:

- SCVI Nuclear Diagnostic Imaging and Radioiodine Therapy Referral Form.
- Hyperthyroidism diagnosis lab work (Thyroid Panel), exam notes, and current weight.
- Lab work (Chemistry/FELV/FIV/CBC/UA) obtained at the time of diagnosis.
- Lab work (Chemistry/CBC/UA/T4) obtained after the Tapazole trial. NOTE: All lab work must be current and the most recent lab work should be obtained at 1 month or less than the treatment date.
- Whole body radiographs obtained within one month of treatment. Please send these radiographs to SCVI prior to the treatment date. The radiographs can also be taken at SCVI and would be done prior to treatment.
